Introduction

For the teen years, Celebration Education utilizes Spectrum Living's Positive Peer Groups (PPG). Within a safe environment, you can plan for and work on your future today, thus creating more purpose in your studies. You are given more trust and independence as you find and pursue your purpose and passions. This is an important step toward future college, career, and life goals.

At a Celebration Education school, you have the opportunity to:

- Learn what you want to
- Learn when you want to
- Learn for as long as you like
- Learn to the depths of your interest
- Learn in the way that best suits you

This is your opportunity as long as you abide by the three R's. You are expected to be:

- Responsible
- Reasonable
- Respectful

Traditional schools judge a student's academic success based mainly on two intelligences, namely linguistic and mathematic. After all, those are the easiest to measure. However, a Celebration school recognizes and celebrates all intelligences, including:

- Musical
- Spatial
- Social
- Personal
- Natural
- Creative
- Physical
- Spiritual
- Artistic

Learning in any intelligence compliments and increases the other intelligences.

Positive Peer Group (PPG) Weekly Schedule

A possible weekly scenario for a student in a Positive Peer Group through Celebration Education:

Monday

- Independent study/personal projects
- Meet with tutor

Tuesday

- Independent study/personal projects
- Enrichment Class

Wednesday

- Meet with mentor
- Positive Peer Group meeting

Thursday

- Field trip

Friday

- Independent study/personal projects

As you can see, this schedule affords you lots of time to learn and work on projects just for you, while allowing for time with a tutor and mentor, time with peers, and also to explore common interests with peers. Not all learning needs to be book learning, as our brain has many avenues to receive information. None of these activities are required.

At the heart of this plan are the Positive Peer Group meetings. At these meetings, teens will be introduced to powerful concepts such as:

- Discovering Purpose
- Priority Setting
- Financial Literacy
- Project Planning
- Time Management
- Organization Skills
- True Leadership
- Entrepreneurship
- Philanthropy
- Habits of Greatness
- Teambuilding

This is done with a small group of teens that are capable of respecting differences and encouraging strengths.

Celebration Policies and Procedures

Attendance Requirements

You are considered "present" for school each day you engage in educational activities, whether at home or at a Celebration event. Please realize that a Celebration Education is not a legal way to skip school. Rather, it is an opportunity for you to do more with your education than you might have imagined.

Celebration Education does not place requirements on students, so you are not required to attend any of the activities or participate in any of the learning experiences. If you do attend and you are bored, you are welcome to leave the activity. It would be inappropriate for you to stay and become a distraction to the other students.

We recognize that school is not the only location where learning can happen. Therefore, if you do not attend, it is assumed that you have chosen a different learning experience for that day. There is no minimum number of days that you must attend school activities. However, it would be appropriate to let us know when you expect to miss a school day.

If you are enrolled in Celebration Education and you start to miss regularly, you might want to consider another educational route. If an absence is prolonged - whether expected or not - we would discuss with you the option of disenrollment.

Dismissal

Alcohol, drugs, cigarettes, weapons, fighting, bullying, racism, pornography, stealing, and lying will not be tolerated. Any student or adult found participating in any of these activities could face severe penalties up to and including suspension and expulsion of the student(s).

Celebration Education reserves the right to dismiss students at its sole discretion.

Materials

When you sign up for a plan, you are given a materials allowance. This is the maximum dollar amount of the materials you are permitted take home at any time. These materials have no due dates and they may be exchanged throughout the school year. At the end of the school year, you may keep that dollar amount of materials.

Please see that items that you take home are properly recorded prior to their leaving the premises.

Any “consumable” materials (workbooks, journals, construction paper, etc.) can only be returned if they have no visible marks on them.

If materials are returned in poor condition, their dollar value will be deducted from the student's annual materials allowance. The student may keep these materials or donate them back to the school.

Sharing Time

Sharing Time is an opportunity for you to share anything you have been working on. We encourage you to share your educational accomplishments, but you are welcome to share anything that is important to you. You are not required to share.

Emotionally Safe Environment

Celebration Education is committed to providing an emotionally safe environment for the students. This means that we do not tolerate put-downs of any kind. We need to be especially careful that we do not (even accidentally) talk down to, gossip about, or say unkind things to anyone. We will all help one another in this, so as to minimize the problem. If an individual (student or staff) has difficulty abiding by this rule, they may be removed from the school.

Religion

This is not a religious school. However, we suppose that the majority of the students are religious. Celebration encourages each individual's devotion. We do not expect you to separate your religion from your education. You are welcome to share things that are religious in nature, but please be respectful to others who do not share your beliefs.

Tutors/Mentors

If you chose a plan that includes time with a tutor or mentor, you may meet with a tutor or a mentor once each week.

Tutors are people who can help you strengthen your academic weaknesses or learn specific skills or concepts.

Mentors are persons who can help you increase your strengths and help direct you to find learning experiences that would be appropriate for your interests. All our mentors are also tutors. Not all our tutors are Celebration-trained mentors.

From week to week, you may choose from among Celebration's mentors and tutors. You may choose the person according to your own educational needs and how comfortable you are with that person.

You will be given a list of tutors and mentors. You may contact the tutor or mentor directly to make arrangements to meet. You are welcome to meet at the Celebration facility before or after Celebration activities, or you may meet at another public location, such as the local library.

Adjusting to a Celebration Education School

Because a Celebration School is so different from traditional schools, you might experience an understandable foreign feeling, as compared to what most people consider "school" should feel like. Knowing that all new situations feel awkward at first, please be patient during this adjustment period and soon learning will become as natural to you as eating is.

It is not just lip service when we say that you get to choose what you to learn. Remember that keeping busy with textbooks, filling out worksheets, and taking tests are the lowest forms of learning. Students in a Celebration school are free of these restrictions and are allowed to learn in ways that are more compatible for their individual learning styles. This way, the learning is quicker and more memorable. Please talk to a staff member if you have any concerns about your progress.

Enrollment

You do not need to enroll with Celebration in order to attend any of our events. "Enrollment" means that Celebration Education keeps your official school records. This costs an additional \$100. If you are not enrolled with Celebration, you can file your own private school affidavit, sign up with a charter school, or enroll with another independent study school.

Celebration Education promises:

- To treat students with respect at all times.
- Meaningful, fun and brain-friendly learning experiences.
- Valuable take-home materials.
- Quality field trips.
- Valuable 6-week classes.
- Knowledgeable tutors and mentors.

As a student at a Celebration Education school, you promise to:

- Show respect to fellow students, Celebration staff, school facilities, and any third-party educators or facilities.
- Wear clean, comfortable, and modest clothing.
- Help keep facilities clean.
- Be honest.
- Properly care for school materials.
- Attend weekly Positive Peer Group meetings.

- Spend a large amount of time in educational pursuits and productive hobbies.
- Make appointments to visit a tutor or mentor each week (if your plan includes tutoring).
- Sign up for classes and field trips in a timely manner; cancel when necessary so that others may fill that spot.
- See that the items you check out are properly recorded prior to taking them home.
- Arrive a little early, as activities will start at the times they are scheduled for.
- Turn in monthly attendance records (not necessary if you are enrolled in another school situation).
- Pay for each month by the last school day of the previous month, unless other arrangements have been made (see payment schedule).
- Do your best in all of your educational activities.

Application Process:

1. Attend a free parent discussion or complimentary school day (Optional)
2. Complete the application
3. Turn in the application, along with tuition for the first term (See Fee Schedule)

Note: This application is for students enrolling in either the Super Deluxe or Basic Positive Peer Groups plans. For occasional participation in Celebration's classes and field trips, you do not need to complete these forms.
